
Dear Mr. Siegenthaler:

While it has been impossible for us to get any suggestion as to the definite date when the land conveyances from the War Department will be terminated, I have been advised by Col. Pockras that he will join the Board in making its inspection trip of certain areas, including Charles Mill, on Saturday or Sunday, October 21 or 22. It is my opinion that this should give us an opportunity to inform him ^{further} concerning your problem and perhaps secure his assistance in solving it.

While we will be under considerable pressure in an effort to include as much territory as possible within a limited time, it seems probable that we could take the time to confer at the lake with the committee representing your organization. This would necessarily be quite limited.

According to the information given me by the Huntington office of the Corps of Engineers, this conveyance matter now rests with the Real Estate Department of the Division U. S. Engineer Office at Columbus. Because of the pressure of military matters, there seems to be no effort to expedite the transfer. It is my hope that, if Colonel Pockras became sufficiently interested, he might be able to speed things up.
